I mentioned a Bankruptcy Appeal to you where we acted for the Petitioning Creditor and a Bankruptcy Order was made. The Bankrupt has lodged an Appeal which is due to be heard on the 13th August 1996 at 10.30 a.m. as a first fixture at The Queen Elizabeth II Law Courts, Derby Square, Liverpool.

If the Appeal proceeds, we would wish to instruct Mr. Musaheb to appear on behalf of the Creditor and I wonder if you could pencil the matter in his diary at this time. If he is not available, then please telephone to discuss alternatives.

I refer to the matter being pencilled in at this stage because there may be some doubt about the Appeal proceeding. Neither the Official Receiver, nor ourselves, nor our Clients have been served with any Notice of Appeal, nor seen any Grounds of Appeal or anything whatsoever from the Appellant's Solicitors. That is consistent with their completely cavalier attitude to such matters and perhaps you could ask Mr. Musaheb to telephone the Writer for a brief discussion as to whether any Application should be made at this stage prior to the Appeal.
